INSPIRE: Seven Strategies to End Violence Against Children Talking Points and Frequently Asked Questions for INSPIRE Workgroup Members

INSPIRE: Seven strategies for ending violence against children is an evidence-based resource to support countries in their efforts to prevent and respond to violence against children.

- Each letter of the word INSPIRE stands for one of the strategies, which are: Implementation and enforcement of laws; Norms and values; Safe environments; Parent and caregiver support; Income and economic strengthening; Response and support services; and Education and life skills.
- At heart, INSPIRE is a framework for guiding action to prevent all forms of violence against children that is based on evidence and provides a unifying strategy.

Who leads INSPIRE?

 The INSPIRE Working Group (IWG) is co-chaired by the World Health Organization and the Institute for Security Studies who also serve on the IWG Secretariat along with the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC); UNODC, Joining Forces, CPC Learning Network and the Global Partnership to End Violence Against Children (End Violence). How were the strategies and interventions identified?

- The strategies and most interventions included in INSPIRE were identified through reviews of the scientific literature on what works to prevent and respond to violence against children.
- They include interventions shown to be effective in reducing the prevalence of violence against children and risk factors for such violence, and in strengthening factors that protect against it, and preference was given to those that have been tested in low- and middle-income countries.
- The detailed criteria for inclusion are set out in Section III of the INSPIRE core document.

Who should implement the INSPIRE strategies?

• INSPIRE is intended for a wide audience, including, policymakers and legislators; civil society actors, practitioners and implementors of violence prevention programmes; NGOs, funders of social, economic, humanitarian, and civil society initiatives; and advocates working in the violence against children sector.

What is INSPIRE's global reach?

- The INSPIRE framework has been translated into 14 languages, and more than 65 countries have shown engagement with the framework at the national or local levels.
- In additional to local communications products developed but partners, the INSPIRE Working Group launched a website, three global videos, a series of seven podcasts (<u>Inspiring Ways to End Violence</u> <u>Against Children: the podcast | End Violence (end-violence.org)</u>, and eight webinars (<u>Webinars and</u> <u>multimedia | INSPIRE (inspire-strategies.org)</u>.

How can progress and impact of INSPIRE be measured?

• In addition to the INSPIRE core document, the INSPIRE Indicator Guidance and Results Framework provides a core set of indicators and a results framework to support governments and organizations to

- monitor the prevalence of violence, risk and protective factors, and the implementation and impact of the INSPIRE strategies.
- Indicators are provided for each of the seven strategies and for multi-sectoral action and monitoring and evaluation. Data for most of the indicators can be obtained using questions from existing survey instruments, which are highlighted in the guidance.
